

Giustizia e diritti in Israele e in Palestina

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Human rights and collective rights (women, colonial peoples, minorities etc.) have been progressively enlarged throughout modernity, and especially after the fall of fascist barbarity. The Geneva Conventions, Roma Convention and hundreds of other resolutions by the international community organizations, are the direct and indirect product of the Judeocide of WWII.

Israel too is a product of the Nazi genocide: but why should the Palestinians, who had no part in this crime, to pay the price? It is 100% unjust.

The Neo-conservative counter-reform initiated a deregulation of post-WWI international law (as well as many other progressive achievements). The creation of Israel on the land of the Palestinians was a colossal denial of justice. It can be minimized by granting the Palestinians a maximum of collective and individual rights.
