The Seminar will also include the exhibition of the **Virtual Museum on the Italian Cultural Heritage “Virtual Journey on the Renaissances of the Museum of Italy - Little Steps”**, first launched during the last year’s edition of the Seminar. It is the first such a project on a global stage, aiming to highlight the importance of some of the most

significant Italian UNESCO sites through virtual immersion (3D glasses), thus allowing viewers to experience first-hand the beauty of the Italian cultural heritage, enhancing the strong profile of the country in this field. The Museum includes four 360-degree virtual rooms with 3D glasses (Castel Del Monte in Apulia, the Laurentian Library and Medici Chapels in Florence, the Historic Center of Rome with the Ara Pacis, Venice with its Lagoon and St. Mark's Square) and a fifth room in 3D Virtual Reality. The Museum project is headed by its **Artistic Director** Sergio Iovino and its **Curator** Giulia Parenti, **with contributions from** Silvia De Gennaro Lino Strangis.
